

Mawae Morton is the Strategic Resources Manager within the Endowment Group at Kamehameha Schools in Hawai'i. He leads a team which advises KS on strategic issues and opportunities for its land assets portfolio - including energy, agriculture, water resource management and sustainability.



Kamehameha Schools (KS) mission is to improve the well being of the native Hawaiian people through education opportunities. KS is the largest private land owner in Hawai'i with around 367,000 acres of land statewide. These Hawai'i lands make up about a third of KS' \$10 billion endowment value.

As part of his KS responsibilities, Mawae is a Director for the First Nations' Futures Program (FNFP), a leadership development initiative between Kamehameha Schools, Stanford University and New Zealand Maori tribes.

Mawae also serves as Senior Vice President with Hawai'i BioEnergy (HBE), a partnership between Kamehameha Schools, Maui Land & Pineapple Co., Grove Farm, Vinod Khosla, Finistere Ventures and Ohana Holdings (investment vehicle for Pierre Omidyar) dedicated to renewable energy generation for Hawai'i. He helped to establish and lead HBE from 2006 until a fulltime executive team was appointed in 2008.

Prior to joining KS in 2003, Mawae was a senior consultant with KPMG Consulting working in New Zealand, the US and the wider Asia-Pacific region. He has served in numerous community and governance roles, and has held several senior policy positions with the New Zealand government.

Mawae holds a Bachelor of Agriculture degree from Massey University and a Master of Public Policy degree from Victoria University of Wellington, New Zealand.

Mawae and his wife `Aulani have two sons and live in Hawaiikai on O`ahu.
